### I. PEOPLE

A. Physical Distancing. To ensure employees comply with physical distancing requirements, you agree that you will do the following:

~	Ensure 6 ft. distance between personnel, unless safety or core function of the work activity requires
	a shorter distance. Any time personnel are less than 6 ft. apart from one another, personnel must
	wear acceptable face coverings.

~	Tightly confined spaces will be occupied by only one individual at a time, unless all occupants are
	wearing face coverings. If occupied by more than one person, will keep occupancy under 50% of
	maximum capacity.

~	Post social distancing markers using tape or signs that denote 6 ft. of spacing in commonly used and other applicable areas on the site (e.g. clock in/out stations, health screening stations)
~	Limit in-person gatherings as much as possible and use tele- or video-conferencing whenever possible. Essential in-person gatherings (e.g. meetings) should be held in open, well-ventilated spaces with appropriate social distancing among participants.
<b>v</b>	Establish designated areas for pick-ups and deliveries, limiting contact to the extent possible.

### II. PLACES

A. Protective Equipment. To ensure employees comply with protective equipment requirements, you agree that you will do the following:

Employers must provide employees with an acceptable face covering at no-cost to the employee and have an adequate supply of coverings in case of replacement.

The Inn will maintain sufficient supply of surgical mask and other PPE. The supply will be monitored daily and ordered from our vendor as needed

	lygiene and Cleaning. To ensure employees comply with hygiene and cleaning requirements, you see that you will do the following:
<b>v</b>	Adhere to hygiene and sanitation requirements from the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u> (CDC) and <u>Department of Health</u> (DOH) and maintain cleaning logs on site that document date, time, and scope of cleaning.
	Who will be responsible for maintaining a cleaning log? Where will the log be kept?  The Inn staff will sanitize and maintain a cleaning log after each visit, the log will be kept in the main office of the inn
<b>v</b> ]	Provide and maintain hand hygiene stations for personnel, including handwashing with soap, water, and paper towels, or an alcohol-based hand sanitizer containing 60% or more alcohol for areas where handwashing is not feasible.
	Where on the work location will you provide employees with access to the appropriate hand hygiene and/or sanitizing products and how will you promote good hand hygiene? Hand sanitizer is located throuhout the community and on medication carts. Common restrooms will be stocked appropriately at all times to ensure proper hand hygiene

~	Conduct regular cleaning and disinfection at least after every shift, daily, or more frequently as
	needed, and frequent cleaning and disinfection of shared objects (e.g. tools, machinery) and
	surfaces, as well as high transit areas, such as restrooms and common areas, must be completed.

What policies will you implement to ensure regular cleaning and disinfection of your worksite and any shared objects or materials, using <u>products</u> identified as effective against COVID-19? Housekeeping will sanitize and disinfect common areas, Inn staff will be repsonsible for maininting and disinfecting mediaction cart

C. Communication. To ensure the business and its employees comply with communication requirements, you agree that you will do the following:

- Post signage throughout the site to remind personnel to adhere to proper hygiene, social distancing rules, appropriate use of PPE, and cleaning and disinfecting protocols.
- Establish a communication plan for employees, visitors, and customers with a consistent means to provide updated information.
- Maintain a continuous log of every person, including workers and visitors, who may have close contact with other individuals at the work site or area; excluding deliveries that are performed with appropriate PPE or through contactless means; excluding customers, who may be encouraged to provide contact information to be logged but are not mandated to do so.

The front desk will maintain a log of all visitors and workers. The log will be located in the Inn main office

If a worker tests positive for COVID-19, employer must immediately notify state and local health departments and cooperate with contact tracing efforts, including notification of potential contacts, such as workers or visitors who had close contact with the individual, while maintaining confidentiality required by state and federal law and regulations.

If a worker tests positive for COVID-19, which employee(s) will be responsible for notifying state and local health departments?

The Administrator will be repsonsible to notify the state and local health departments of any positive tests

### III. PROCESS

A. Screening. To ensure the business and its employees comply with protective equipment requirements, you agree that you will do the following:

Implement mandatory health screening assessment (e.g. questionnaire, temperature check) before employees begin work each day and for essential visitors, asking about (1) COVID-19 <a href="mailto:symptoms">symptoms</a> in past 14 days, (2) positive COVID-19 test in past 14 days, and/or (3) close contact with confirmed or suspected COVID-19 case in past 14 days. Assessment responses must be reviewed every day and such review must be documented.

What type(s) of daily health and screening practices will you implement? Will the screening be done before employee gets to work or on site? Who will be responsible for performing them, and how will those individuals be trained?

Employees will undergo a temperature check upon arrival for their shift, the front desk staff will be responsible for performing them. Repsonsible staff will have undergone training on screening measures to ensure staff continued staff safety

If screening onsite, how much PPE will be required for the responsible parties carrying out the screening practices? How will you supply this PPE?

PPE will be supplied by the maintenance department, appropriate quantities will be available at the front desk at all times

B. Contact tracing and disinfection of contaminated areas. To ensure the business and its employees comply with contact tracing and disinfection requirements, you agree that you will do the following:

Family Visitation will occur as follows:

The Inn has developed policy and procedures based on guidance dated July 10, 2020

Family members will be limited to two per visitation, they are required to call and schedule a visit during a desinated time.

Family members will undergo a screening process prior to any visit, the screening tool will be maintained onsite for any contact tracing needs.

Visits will occur outdoors on our patio

Residents and Visitors will wear masks at all times

Surfaces will be disinfected between each visit.

Appropriate PPE, Signage, and Visual Social Distance ques will be available at all times

Visits will be limited to 4 per day and all residents will be given the opportunity to see a family member
